Media interns will work with the Foundation's director of media relations in writing and editing press releases, commentaries, and other media products. They will attend staff meetings, meet policymakers, and engage in regular policy discussions. Oral presentations and mock-job interviews are also part of the program.

Applicants should demonstrate a commitment to free-market principles, strong writing and communications skills, and a general understanding of government and the political process, as well as the initiative and ability to undertake research, writing, technical, and administrative projects. Full-time and part-time media internships are available with a stipend of up to \$500 for Fall and Spring semesters and \$1,000 for the Summer.
