Pete Flores had a distinguished career spanning 27 years with the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department rising to the highest-ranking Game Warden where he was responsible for a \$60 million budget, 27 field offices, 700 plus employees and operations in land, sea and air. Pete is the son of a career Air Force Master Sergeant and was taught to respect his elders, his family, his country and to be an honorable man in whatever endeavor and path God chose for him.

Pete retired from TPWD as a Colonel in 2012 and made his home in Pleasanton. After an unsuccessful run for the Texas Senate in 2015, Pete ran again in a 2018 Special Election and was elected as the first

Hispanic Republican Texas Senator in history.

Elected to the Texas Senate in 2018, Pete ensured that south and west Texas got the resources and support they needed to prosper and succeed. Pete is a no-nonsense leader who gets the job done.

Serving in the 86th Legislature, Pete instantly earned the respect of Senate leadership and the members. He was appointed to six committees including Senate Finance, Natural Resources, Health and Human Services, Criminal Justice, Higher Education, and redistricting. His experience with the Legislative process and the financial methodology along with the relationships in the House, Senate and the Leadership came to serve his constituents positively with their voice being heard.
