U.S. Congregman Chip Day

Rep. Chip Roy is a devoted husband and father of two children. He is currently serving his third term in the U.S. House of Representatives, where he is honored to represent Texas's 21st Congressional District, which includes the heart of Texas – South Austin, North San Antonio, and the beautiful Texas Hill Country.

Congressman Roy's career has been dedicated to serving the great state of Texas. Before his election to Congress, Rep. Roy spent time in the United States Senate, where he served as Chief of Staff to Senator Ted Cruz and Chief Counsel and Staff Director to Senator John Cornyn. Roy also served as First Assistant Attorney General under Ken Paxton, Senior Advisor to Texas Governor Rick Perry, and as a federal prosecutor. Before entering public service, he worked for nearly three years as an investment banking analyst.

During his time in Congress, Rep. Roy has quickly established himself as a common-sense conservative firebrand and policy expert, placing him on the forefront of many battles against the D.C. Swamp. He has led his colleagues in battles against Washington's out-of-control spending, the border crisis, radical anti-fossil fuel agendas, COVID-19 mandates and lockdowns, as well as the weaponization of the federal government.

In January, Congressman Roy led twenty Republican Members to advocate for rules changes to the House of Representatives during the Speaker of the House debate. Due to his steadfast devotion to fight for the American people, the House of Representatives established new rules to empower all Members in the House once again. These new rules changes have led to the recent success of House Republicans on bills such as the "Limit, Save, Grow Act" and the "Secure the Border Act."

Congressman Roy currently serves on the House Judiciary Committee, House Committee on Rules, and House Budget Committee. He has previously served on the House Oversight Committee, and House Committee on Veterans Affairs. Rep. Roy is a member of the Freedom Caucus, where he serves as Policy Chair.
