

MARK MEADOWS, SENIOR PARTNER, CPI

Mark Meadows began serving North Carolina's eleventh congressional district in January 2013 after a nearly 30-year career in business.

From the moment he arrived in Washington, Meadows gained a reputation as a principled conservative, a skilled negotiator, and a man of unshakable faith. In November 2016, he was elected as the second chairman of the House Freedom Caucus—which he co-founded in January of 2015. Meadows led this group of roughly three dozen conservative lawmakers through numerous high profile legislative battles—on healthcare, taxes, immigration, government funding, and more.

In March 2020, Meadows left Congress for the White House to serve as President Donald J. Trump's chief of staff. For a year, he was the president's gatekeeper and top advisor, and as President Trump called him, "the guy who never stops working." Meadows shared his experience as chief of staff in the 2021 memoir, *The Chief's Chief*.

Since January 2021, Meadows has served as senior partner at the Conservative Partnership Institute, where he helps lead the organization's efforts to train, equip, and unite the conservative movement. Mark and his wife Debbie have two married children and four grandchildren.
